



Veteran Memorial Sites along the Currier & Ives Scenic Byway Henniker, Hopkinton, Webster, and Salisbury, NH Compiled by Ellen Kontinos-Cilley, Webster, NH

Henniker

1. **Army Sgt. Russell M. Durgin Bridge** - Route 114 – Died in action June 13, 2006 Afghanistan
2. **Soldier & Sailor Monument** - Next to Cogswell Memorial School on Western Ave – Full bust of Col. Leander W. Cogswell – “This monument is erected in memory of Col. Leander W. Cogswell and the men of Henniker who fought in all American Wars” – Engraved plaques on other 3 sides with names of Henniker men who saw service in Revolutionary War thru World War I
3. **World War II Monument** – Woodman Park in front of Town Hall 18 Depot Hill Road

Hopkinton

1. **Sean M. Powers Memorial Bridge** - Route 127 – Marine Veteran of two tours in Iraq died in motor vehicle accident while driving home from work as a Hopkinton NH police officer August 14, 2008
2. **Civil War Park** formally known as “The Park” or “Veterans Park” across street from First Congregational Church of Hopkinton Route 103 – monuments to those who served in Revolutionary, Mexican, Spanish, Civil, Korean, Vietnam, WWI and WWII

Webster

1. **Sgt. William J. Tracy Memorial Bridge** – Route 127 – Dedicated to Army Spc. William Tracy died on duty February 25, 2003 in helicopter crash Kuwait – Operation Enduring Freedom
2. **William R. Pearson Memorial Park** - Route 127 behind Webster Elementary School – Park dedicated to William R. Pearson killed in Vietnam War April 6, 1972.
3. **Veterans Memorial** – Allen Road & Battle Street (Rte 127) – dedicated to Webster residents who served in major conflicts since World War I.

Salisbury

1. **Veterans Monument** – Salisbury Town Hall by flagpole Academy Hall 9 Old Coach Road
